

As more backyards turn into extra living areas, homeowners choose to replace their existing decking with other decking materials, colors and designs so that it matches the architecture of both the inside and outside of the home

Building detached seating areas into your landscaping, away from the outdoor kitchen and living area, is also gaining popularity. Gazebos, pavilions and pergolas with comfortably plush seating offer a cozy and cool area to enjoy private conversations, or to read and relax outside. Planting local climbing and creeping plants next to the structure will create additional shading and privacy options. For those who enjoy the idea of edible landscaping, beans and peas can be grown seasonally, and are a great climbing option to integrate. Other options will depend on your geographic location and what colors and textures you find beautiful and intriguing.

With the increase in concerns over water shortages over the past decade or so, there has been an upswing in demand for freshwater features. These features, such as rain barrels and stone retaining walls, not only add additional dimension to your lush landscape, but also collect and hold water that can be later used to nourish and sustain your plants. An added bonus? You can save on your utility bills.
