




Dining Al Fresco

4. The purpose of the water feature. A fountain may serve as a focal point while a tumbling waterfall pouring into a pool can be thrilling and even double as a way to enjoy a hydro-therapeutic massage. A water wall set near a fire feature will reflect its dazzling glow while LED deck jets can be used to create stunning visual displays. If there's a certain look you're trying to achieve, it is important to determine its purpose.

5. The safety of the water feature. Water features can be a hazard for pets, children and even wildlife. Carefully plan how you will keep your outdoor living space safe when they are in operation around vulnerable individuals and animals.
